Lisa facilitates and maintains the membership program for CFN. After establishing the membership program in 2009, Lisa organized the inaugural CFN fundraiser: “The Grassroots Gala.” The gala showcased the unique characteristics of Louisville neighborhoods, which included community organizations, food booths, live music and a silent auction. Lisa also serves as Program Director for the Neighborhood Institute. She contributes to the design, content and education of the neighborhood leadership course for Louisville Metro neighborhood and community leaders. Lisa has developed new partnerships for CFN within the Metro Council, Dept. of Health, Louisville Independent Business Alliance and the League of Women Voters, which has lead to financial support as well as collaborative efforts. Her experience as a neighborhood leader has involved preserving and safeguarding environmental issues, facilitating public meetings, as well as planning and administering the Irish Hill Neighborhood Plan.
